THE ROLE

ActionAid Australia is seeking a dynamic Community Mobiliser to join the Campaigns and Policy Team. The position is responsible for coordinating ActionAid Australia's community mobilising and partnership strategy, which aims to build a movement to engage Australians to take action to advance global climate justice and gender equality. This includes supporting and growing ActionAid's Activist Network, coordinating campaign mobilisations and events, building community partnerships, and conducting trainings. The Community Mobiliser will also contribute to the development of ActionAid Australia's ongoing campaign strategy with the Campaigns and Policy team and be part of our efforts to build a strong feminist movement in Australia. This position reports to the Head of Campaigns and Policy.

ActionAid's existing Activist Network consists of groups in Sydney and Melbourne, each led by volunteer Group Coordinator(s).

- Strong project management skills
- Demonstrated ability to manage pressure and competing priorities
- Excellent interpersonal and relationship building skills, including the ability to motivate others, to work as part of a team, and with other stakeholders like partners and volunteers
- A high degree of initiative and self-drive
- The ability to travel overseas if required
