

GLOBAL WOMEN'S RIGHTS

FACT SHEET 2025

According to the UN, it will take another 300 years to achieve gender equality at the rate we're going.

The climate crisis is driving the largest setback to gender equality in our history, because extreme weather and disasters continue to impact women the most.

ECONOMIC JUSTICE

Women perform three times more unpaid work than men.

Women earn 80 cents for every \$1 men earn for work of equal value – with an even wider gap for women with children.

CLIMATE CRISIS

Women and children are 14 times more likely than men to die in a climate disaster.

By 2050, food insecurity caused by climate change is estimated to impact 236 million more women and girls.

GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

Globally, 30% of women aged 15 and older have experienced domestic or sexual violence.

In 2023 alone, 51,100 women and girls were killed by an intimate partners or family member.

PEACE & SECURITY

The proportion of women killed in armed conflicts doubled in 2023 to 40% of all deaths in war.

Countries with 5% more women in parliament are five times less likely to resort to conflict in an international crisis.
